

Inclusion of Other in Self Scale

Response Options: 0=not at all committed; 8= completely committed

Satisfaction level subscale

- 4) All things considered, to what degree do you feel satisfied with your relationship?
- 5) Taking into account all of the qualities that are most important to you, how does your relationship compare to other people's?
- 6) All things considered, how does your relationship compare to your ideal?

Response Options: 0=Not at all satisfied; 8=completely satisfied

- 0= Not at all characteristic of me
- 1= Slightly characteristic of me
- 2= Somewhat characteristic of me
- 3= Moderately characteristic of me
