## **General Impressions**

- 1. What elements of this description seemed to most accurately capture your experience?
- 2. What elements of this description didn't seem to fit your experience? Where do you have questions or concerns about this description?

## **Clarifying Questions**

- 3. <u>Values:</u> To what extent have your personal values/beliefs guided your work with the community? How about your occupational therapy professional values and beliefs?
- 4. <u>Getting started:</u> Can you tell us more about how you initiate your interactions with communities/agencies and why this might be a longer, less clearly defined process?
- 5. <u>Assessment:</u> We heard that there are challenges with conducting formal assessment. What would help you do formal assessment with your communities?
- 6. Occupational Lens: What unique perspective do you bring to your work with communities and how does this help you distinguish what you do from other professionals on your team?
