- 4. What are the main health problems for which an occupational therapy referral could be considered?
- 5. What unmet needs of these clients/patients could correspond to the role of the occupational therapist?
- 6. What skills and competencies of the occupational therapist could be solicited in the context of family medicine groups?
- 7. What are the reasons/needs that would lead you to make a reference in occupational therapy?
