

The Wolves in Sheep's Clothing: How Russia's Internet Research Agency Tweets Appeared in U.S. News as Vox Populi

Appendix A: Selection of top 100 IRA Accounts

We collected from the 1% Twitter archive all tweets from 2015-2017 that either originated from the 2,752 IRA Twitter handles or contained their handles in the tweet text. This gives us 460,143 tweets, the majority (351,501) of which are “retweets” starting with RT or RT@ and only a few (108,642) are non-retweets. Based on the retweet relationship, 239,616 unique edges were created (e.g., if @A retweets @B, then A -- B) containing 168,649 unique nodes/handles. We then sorted the handles by in degree (the times being retweeted by any handle) and selected the top 100 handles. These handles were best-connected in the sense that they received the most retweeting and had their messages spread presumably most far and wide in the Twitter sphere.

Table 1 below displays the 30 handles with the highest in-degree (the times being retweeted by any handle), along with other degree information such as out-degree and total-degree (calculated the same way). For a full list of 100 accounts, please visit this link:
