Clinical Pathway based on the ORN Kidney Care Journey, KFRE: Kidney Failure Risk Equation

- Treatment Options include Transplant, Independent or Assisted Peritoneal Dialysis (PD), Independent or Assisted Home Hemodialysis (HHD), In-Center hemodialysis (ICHD) and Supportive Care
- If patient is new to MCKC clinic & rapidly declining in kidney function, a MCKC nurse will be assigned as the Primary Nurse for coordinating care with the Nurse Navigator to expedite treatment option education
- MCKC nurses to ask nephrologist if it's ok to start the modality education conversation in advance re any contraindications re one specific modality. If Supportive Care chosen, follow "Supportive Care Plan"
